Business Analyst Curriculum Approved by IIBA ONLC Joins Elite Group of Endorsed Education Providers

The IIBA is developing a Business Analyst certification built on its Business Analyst Body of Knowledge (BABOK). The certification should be available in early 2007.

The Standard for Business Analyst Training

"We've been offering courses related to business analysis for over 10 years. However, until recently, there hasn't been a single standardized BA curriculum that has been embraced by training companies and industry. The IIBA has changed all of that," said Jim Palic, ONLC Training Centers' President.

ONLC initially submitted a single course, "Business Analysis for IT Professionals" for IIBA approval. The content in that course was approved and complies with the BABOK standard. In addition, ONLC will be submitting several new course titles for approval in 2007. Topics in those courses include: Requirements Planning, Requirements Analysis and Documentation, and Project Scope Change Management.
